Sustainable livelihoods and entrepreneurship support for rural women

Overview:

Rural women in Karnataka, Maharashtra, and the North-Eastern states of India often encounter significant economic and well-being challenges. These hurdles include socio-cultural barriers, limited education and skill development opportunities, inadequate financial resources, and fragmented support structures. Addressing these challenges is a crucial step to nurture sustainable livelihoods and skill development amongst rural women, enabling them to be truly independent to pursue their aspirations.

Current Landscape:

- 1. **Access to Finance:** Less than 5% of women entrepreneurs receive adequate financial support from institutional sources. [1]
- 2. **Literacy and Education:** In rural Maharashtra, female literacy rates hover around 70%. Similarly, in some North-Eastern states like Assam and Nagaland, it is around 63% and 71.5%, respectively. Meanwhile, rural Karnataka's female literacy rate stands at approximately 59.60%. [2] [3] [4] [5]
- 3. **Labour Force Participation:** Women's participation in the rural workforce is alarmingly low at 34.6%, compared to men's participation rate of 78.8%. [6]
- 4. **Skill Development:** Only 10% of the rural workforce undergoes formal skill training.
- 5. **Entrepreneurship:** A mere 14% of Indian business establishments are led by women, with an even smaller percentage in rural areas. [8]

Creating an inclusive economic and social development landscape for rural women could be done through the following pathways:

1. **Education and Skill Development:** Implement community-based literacy and vocational training programs focusing on relevant new-age skills such as digital & financial literacy and sustainable agricultural practices amongst others.



- Access to Jobs and Supportive Ecosystems: Extend access to financial resources and government schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana amongst others. Establish women-centric cooperative societies, self-help groups (SHGs), peer wellbeing circles, and childcare creches for working women in rural areas.
- 3. **Self-Employment and Entrepreneurship:** Set up incubation and mentorship programs for aspiring women entrepreneurs. Organise workshops on business management, marketing, and digital tools.
- 4. **Community and Policy Engagement:** Advocate for effective implementation of current schemes and requisite policy changes that support women's economic participation. Engage local leaders and communities to change socio-cultural norms that hinder women's economic & social growth.
